

Annual Report FY 21 (July 2020 – June 2021)

Fiscal Year 21 will be known for being fully virtual. Not able to meet in person, we opened portals into our homes and hearts with people around the world. Seeking meaningful connection is core and finding ways to listen and express both grief and gratitude continue to call our attention. Core values of listening, connecting and love, are leading the way. Here's what we have been up to:

BIPOC Voices: Extending welcome and honoring deep listening, we responded to stresses on Black, Indigenous and People of Color through offerings and collaborations. Being in relationship over time takes time, space, and continual welcome. The Art of Listening series amplified BIPOC artist voices and became an affinity space where companionship and support could be centered. Collaborating with the Vermont Releaf Collective for BIPOC farmers, WholeHeart facilitated and mentored others in holding heart-centric community space. Leadership coaching for Health Policy Research Scholars provided support to navigate the academy and address health policy equity issues. As a historically white organization and community, part of our work is to listen deeply and welcome the whole story with multiple voices and ways of living, loving, and connecting.

Community Listening: To address isolation in the pandemic, we responded to the need to stay connected and learn from one another. Here are a few examples of moving from transaction to transformation / single events to concentric circles of practice: Hope Reimagined shifted from a summer series to year round; the 21st year of the Courage Cohort met monthly and welcomed participants from a wide geographic distance; and weekly wellness calls have been providing consistent contact since March 2020. Cross pollination across circles surfaced themes of grief, exhaustion, longing and kindness.

Welcoming the Whole: In this age of personal branding, WholeHeart focuses on "we." Rather than promoting one voice, one way, one leader, we welcome the whole. How do we each show up from a place of knowing our voice and our questions matter? How does reciprocity and relational justice call us into understanding our place and our impact on all relations/encounters? Taking responsibility for how we show up for ourselves, and one another, matters. Acknowledging how the earth keeps showing up for all life, including but not prioritizing one species (humans), is part of living wholeheartedly and relationally.

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


